Getting Started:

1. When you “blew it” as a child, how did you feel about the mistake? About yourself? About others involved?
2. From whom did you then draw comfort: A parent? Sibling? Friend? Your pet?

Digging Deeper:

Read Hebrews 4:13 – 5:10

1. Verse 13 tells us that nothing in all creation is hidden from God’s sight. Why then do we sometimes attempt to hide from God?
2. Verse 14 tells us to “*hold firmly to the faith we profess.*” Why is it essential that we not compromise on our confession of the historical Jesus and our confession of the Christian faith? How does holding fast to our confession in times of trial and temptation work to reveal the genuineness of one’s faith?

3. Hebrews 4:14 – 5:10 gives several reasons why Jesus is the Great High Priest. List those reasons. How are they an encouragement to you in your faith?
4. Jesus was tempted in every way, yet He was without sin. Explain the difference between temptation and sin. How could Jesus be tempted and yet remain sinless?
5. Reread 5:1. In what ways have you tried to represent yourself before God rather than letting Jesus do that?
6. Read 4:16. What does it mean to approach the throne of grace with confidence? What does God give us when we draw near to Him?
