Getting Started:

1. Talk about a time when you pursued something you really wanted [a job, a goal, a romantic relationship, etc.]?

Digging Deeper:

1. Read Philippians 3:7-14. By "knowing Christ," Paul didn't mean just knowing things *about* Jesus. He meant knowing God in a personal and intimate way. How are you pursuing a deep relationship with God in your life? In what ways are you giving Jesus your 'first love'?

2. Read Lamentations 3:22-23. What do these verses tell us about God's daily commitment to us? How should God's daily renewal of His love and grace impact how we lead our lives each day?

3. What can keep us from pursuing God daily [insecurities, sinful behavior, etc.]? Read Hebrews 4:16. How has Jesus overruled our fears of entering God's presence?

4. How do you define worship?

5. Marc shared the results of a survey in which 54 percent of responders said worshipping apart from a local congregation is as valid as worshipping with one. Do you agree or disagree with that opinion? Why or why not?

6. What are some cultural conversations you've been exposed to in this last year? Are you one to avoid these types of conversations, get worked up about them, or engage?

7. Dane Ortlund says, "Only as we drink down the kindness of the heart of Christ will we leave in our wake, everywhere we go, the aroma of heaven, and die one day having startled the world with glimpses of a divine kindness too great to be boxed in by what we deserve."
