Digging Deeper:

Read Isaiah 6:1-8

1. Along with the Isaiah passage, read Revelation 4 and 1 Corinthians 13:12. What is revealed about God in these visions? How is He described? What are His attributes? Why is it significant that the seraphim, who are sinless, still covered their faces before the Lord?
2. What does holy mean? In what ways is God holy? Why do the seraphim say it three times? Why would you say that holiness is one of the most important qualities for us as sinners to embrace?
3. What effect did this awesome heavenly scene have on Isaiah? Can you recall a time in your life when you were brought to a similar awareness of your sin? What was your response?
4. What was God's response to Isaiah's recognition of sin? Read Isaiah 53:4-12. What emotions well up within you as you read this passage about Christ?
5. What was Isaiah's response to God's call? What prompted this eagerness within him? In what ways have you said yes to God's call to send or use you?
6. Pastor Marc made a statement, "The outpouring of my worship is proportional to the size of my God." Though God does not change in size, our view of him does. How does a grand view of God change your whole-life worship? What view of God do you have right now? How can our group help one another gain a grander view of God?
