Personal Study/Growth Group Discussion Questions

Getting started:

1. What person had the greatest impact on your spiritual development?

Digging deeper:

Read Colossians 2:6-8 and 2 Timothy 3:14-17.

1. In verses 6-7, Paul lists several attributes that should mark our lives as believers in Christ Jesus our Lord. What are those attributes? How are they cultivated in our lives?

2. Reread verse 8. The Greek word translated as 'captive' means to take control, completely manipulate a person, or carry someone off as plunder. In what ways is our culture seeking to take kids captive? What does our culture want our children to believe?

3. Read 2 Timothy 3:14-17 and 1:5. Who taught and trained Timothy in the faith? When did his biblical instruction start? What impact did the things he learned from infancy have on him and others throughout history?

4. Many Christian adults don't have a distinctly Christian worldview. An important question to ask ourselves is, "Does my way of looking at the world correspond to the world as it is according to God in the Bible?" How do you answer that question for yourself?

5. Read Ephesians 2:10. Why did God create each of us? How can we teach children and students to love and serve the Lord with all of their heart, mind, soul, and strength?

Taking it Home:

1. How biblical is your worldview? What steps can you take to make your perspective on life and the world more focused on God and His Word?
