Getting started:

1. When did you first hear of God's love for you?

Digging deeper:

Read Micah 2:12-13

1. After two chapters of promised judgment, God suddenly promises to gather His people for blessing. Who is God specifically referring to? Why does God offer this word of hope at this time?
2. What does the Lord mean by "the remnant" in verse 12? How do they stand out from the rest of the people?
3. Review the three characteristics of God's faithful remnant. Discuss each one. What does it mean to be weak in the flesh, holy to the Lord, and strong in His might?

4. God promises to protect His faithful people in times of trouble [see Isaiah 41:10; 54:17; Psalm 91:1-16]. Why, then, do we still experience pain and suffering in this life?

5. As a shepherd provides for his sheep, God promises to meet all our needs. Has this been true for you? What need(s) are you waiting for God to provide right now?

6. How does the promise that God will deliver His faithful remnant from evil give you hope today?
