Getting started:

1. How has Micah helped you grow in acting justly, loving mercy, and walking humbly with your God?

Digging deeper:

Read Micah 7:14-20

1. Micah's 41 years of preaching and prophesying ended. Now, in his "retirement," he offers prayer and praise to God. What is he thankful for?
2. In verse 14, Micah refers to believers as "*the flock of your [God's] inheritance.*" Micah reminds the Lord that believers are His beloved people and His treasure. Why do we struggle to see ourselves as God sees us—as His beloved and treasure?
3. Micah began chapter 7 by expressing his deep anguish and grief. "*What misery is mine!*" he exclaimed. Now, at the end of the chapter, he speaks of prayer and praise. How can misery, prayer, and praise coexist in the life of a believer?

4. This present darkness should drive us to prayer. Do you agree with that statement? What is your default response to the chaos in our country and the struggles in your own life? Is it prayer? Anxiety? Anger? Something else?

5. Verses 16-17 gave solid assurance that God would overcome evildoers. There would be a reversal of fortunes, and the Lord will triumph. Who, ultimately, are the evildoers waging war against God and His kingdom? Read Ephesians 6:10-20. How does this affect how we view people who are being manipulated by the evil one?

6. Read verses 18-20. Micah asks, "*Who is a God like you?*" What do these verses tell us about the nature and character of the Lord?
