Digging Deeper:

Galatians 2:11-21

1. What is the crux of the argument between Peter and Paul? Why is Paul so aggressive in his confrontation with Peter? What was at stake? 4. Reread Galatians 2:17-21 and Matthew 16:24-27. Paul asks, "Does Christ promote sin?" Put another way, "If faith in Christ is sufficient to forgive sin, why not sin big?" How do Matthew and Galatians help answer these questions?
