Personal Study/Growth Group Discussion Questions

Getting Started:

1. Who in your family is most afraid of the dark and why?

4. Read John 1:1-9; 8:12. How do you reconcile the fact that Jesus says He alone is the light, but describes Christians as light as well? What helps your light to burn bright?

Digging Deeper:

Read Matthew 5:13-16

1. Who did Jesus direct his comments to when he called them salt and light (read Matthew 4:23-5:1)? What did Jesus envision would take place through his followers?

5. Jesus cautions us not to lose our 'saltiness' and not to hide our light. How might this happen? What can we do to prevent it?

2. Salt has a preserving effect, is savory, and creates thirst. How are these descriptions to influence the life of a Christ follower as they live in the world? How do you personally embody each one? Where might you need to grow?

6. Read Colossians 1:13. What did Christ do for you? What significance has this had in your life? In what way does this lead us to empathy and compassion?

3. What is the relationship between the beatitudes in verses 3-10 and the call to be salt and light in verses 13-16? Why are the beatitudes so critical to our calling?

7. After the assassination of Charlie Kirk, non-believers are turning to the church and to the Lord in large numbers. There seems to be a spiritual hunger in our world. How might God want to use you, as the salt of the earth and light of the world, to participate in the good God is bringing about through this tragedy?
